

North Helpline

North Helpline is a food bank and emergency services center located in two facilities in the Lake City and Bitter Lake neighborhoods. The food bank provides groceries to approximately 1,500 individuals over three weekly distributions. In addition to food, they provide hygiene products, household supplies, hats, jackets and gloves, pet food, help with eviction notices and water and heat shut-offs. They are able to help with referrals to other agencies as well.



Duwamish Real Rent

Money donated to Real Rent goes to the non-profit Duwamish Tribal Services, Inc., run by the Duwamish Tribe. The mission of the Duwamish Tribal Services, Inc. is to promote the social, cultural, political and economic survival of the Duwamish Tribe. The United states government (so far) refuses to acknowledge the Duwamish Tribe and the tribe is thus not eligible for federal benefits or the land compensation provided for in the 1855 Treaty of Point Elliot, signed by Chief Si'ahl (Seattl) of the Duwamish. The Duwamish Tribe continues to pursue federal acknowledgement through legal action.
